

### **Principal's Report**

Welcome back everyone! We missed you all so much and are very glad to have our normal learning routines back in place. I am so very grateful for the unfailing support, kind messages, assistance and thoughtful gestures the staff received from our community and feel extremely lucky to be part of such an outstanding school.

Our students have come back straight into rich learning activities and we are also taking time to look at student wellbeing through the 'Worry Woos' emotion program and also re-establishing classroom and school routines.

I would like to acknowledge the wonderful work from our staff during the unprecedented times in education. We are very lucky to have such a dedicated, committed and caring staff who go above and beyond to support our students.

### School Attendance

Now that we are back full time all students should be at school unless:

- They have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition.
- They are currently unwell.

If your child is unwell, please do not send them to school. If they are unwell at school you or your nominated emergency contact will need to collect them immediately. Please make



sure your contact details are up to date. If a student is absent without a medical reason for more than two days, this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence and followed up by the school. If you need any support to get your child back to school, please contact us.

### Electronic Gates, cameras and speakers

We have our new electronic gates installed. Both the pedestrian and driveway gates are now electronic and we are very grateful to the Department of Education for installing these and for covering the cost which was over \$50,000. It adds another layer of security and safety to our school as we know who is entering the gates at all times. The pedestrian gate, driveway gate and staff carpark, morning playground and the back path leading to the toilets now have video surveillance cameras installed. There is a monitor both in the front office and principals office to monitor people coming and going throughout the day. Once we are back open as usual you are welcome to come into the office to see the monitors and the position of the cameras. These camera record 24 hours, 7 days a week for our safety and security.

If you need to enter the school during the day please ring the bell on the pedestrian gate and the office will talk to you through the intercom. The office can see through the monitors who is at the gate. Please make sure that you close the gate behind you. To exit the school you will also need to press the bell for the office to release the gate, it will not automatically open.

We also have had new internal speakers placed into all classrooms so they can clearly hear announcements, the bell and emergency tones. We have also updated the locks on classroom doors. These were at a cost of \$10,000 paid for out of the school budget.



### Playground update

The students were very excited to return to see new sandstone rocks around the garden in the big playground. They look amazing and the students have had a fantastic time climbing and walking over them. They were purchased out of a grant that we received from the local schools community fund grant from Tony Burke and we are very appreciative of the support. As part of this grant we have also repaired and upgraded the sandpit. We are hoping that the sandpit will be open for students to use this week. The SRC will be doing some fundraising later this term for toys to use in the sandpit.



This week we are having a small patch of synthetic grass installed to replace some of the bark chips. This will provide a place where our students can run and play ball games without tripping over the bark. This is costing the school over \$25,000. We can't afford to replace all of

the bark chips at this current time but are getting the areas that will still have bark chips topped up with certified play bark. Thank you to Mrs Chamron and Mrs Dion who have been working so hard to upgrade our play areas and gardens. They have also been doing lots of work with the students in the flower gardens in the morning area.

Thanks to Mrs Chamron and Mrs Dion we were also very lucky to have had a garden shed donated by Bunnings Greenacre for use with our vegetable garden down the back. Our students love the gardening

program and we are very excited to see our playground slowing taking shape. We can't wait until it is all complete and we can do an official opening of the areas. We look forward to showing it to you all soon.

#### **Bankstown South Infants School**

The big shade sail cloth in the morning area that blew off in the storms in February has been replaced at a cost of \$20,000. Again, we are very grateful to the P&C for supporting us and contributing \$4000 towards the cost. The remainder of the cost came from our school budget as structures are not covered under insurance. We have really relied on the P&C budget this year and we will be looking to raise more funds throughout the year to build our account back up. As we continue to say all money goes straight back into supporting students so please support our P&C and their fundraising efforts. Thank you to our wonderful P&C for being so supportive of our school.

### School wellbeing policy update

Thank you to the parents who joined us last term for our parent forum on updating our school wellbeing policy. We have updated the policy and will be sharing this with you all next week.

Each student in K-2 has received a clear A5 plastic envelope with their name on it. This is to store their star awards in. Star awards are handed out to students who display our 3 school core values of being safe, respectful and a learner. Students are responsible for looking after



their own star awards and we suggest keeping them in the folder in their bag.

20 Star awards = 1 Bronze award

20 Star awards + 1 Bronze award = Silver Award

20 Start awards + 1 silver award = Gold award


Students need to track their own star awards and hand them to their class teacher when they have received 20.

You may now fill out the waiting list form to secure your place at our preschool. Limited places are available. The forms can be found on our school website under the preschool tab or the enrolment tab.



In English, students are practising their reading and spelling and are writing information reports. In mathematics, we have been refining our place value, addition, fractions and data skills.




















### **KS Class Report**

### Community Languages

Currently as part of the enrolment process, parents indicated what language a child speaks at home. At Bankstown South Infants School, we currently offer a community language program in Arabic and Vietnamese.

All students who have indicated that they speak either Arabic or Vietnamese on their enrolment form are automatically enrolled in these classes. Students attend these lessons once a week. Mrs Haddara teaches our Arabic class and Mrs Ma teaches our Vietnamese class.

These classes are also open to students from other language backgrounds if requested by families. If there are any changes to students attending these lessons, parents must do so in writing to the school.






### Sign in system (PASSTAB)

## After school care bus from Padstow North Public School to Bankstown South Infants School

### Dear families,

South Eastern Community Connect (SECC) is the not-for-profit organisation which runs several local before-and-after-school services called SMOOSH. This term, SMOOSH is looking at providing an additional service which will involve transporting students from Padstow North Public School (PNPS) to Bankstown South Infants School (BSIS) for after-school care.

PNPS students will be picked up at 3:00pm in a minivan driven by a SMOOSH staff member, and will be dropped onsite at BSIS where they will go to the school hall for after school care.

SMOOSH at BSIS operates from 2:45pm - 6:00pm and parents can park onsite in the carpark and collect students from the hall in the afternoon. Afternoon tea is provided for all students as well as a range of indoor and outdoor activities including cooking, craft, gardening and games in the school playground and hall. Students are also provided with a quiet space for homework to be completed when needed.

The prices are very affordable with the government subsidy. SMOOSH is an approved provider of the Child Care Subsidy for Out of School Care (OSHC). For eligible families enrolled in SMOOSH, the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) will assist with reducing the out of pocket child care costs and help to make child care more affordable.
