There have been some changes to the NSW Department of Education guidelines for activities during Term 4. We are hopeful that although there are a number of restrictions that remain in place, that we will be able to offer some additional opportunities for our students.

While there are a number of restrictions that remain in place for parent and carer involvement in school activities, we again take this opportunity to thank our families for their ongoing understanding and support. We look forward to the term ahead and working with our students and community as we continue to work together.

World Teacher's Day

On Friday 30th October we will celebrate World Teacher's Day. We are very lucky to have a wonderful group of teachers at BSIS who consistently go above and beyond to support our students. 2021 Organisation and Class Placements

During Term 4, we spend a great deal of time planning the class structures, staffing and class allocations for the next year. To do this accurately we need to know about children who may not have enrolled to begin Kindergarten, or more importantly, anyone who is leaving for another school. It is essential that we have written advice if your child will be starting late next year or if your family is moving. If your family will not be at school for the start of the school year we need to be supplied with a letter explaining the absence and clearly stating your intended return date. Without this we are not able to include your child when formulating classes and this greatly impacts on the start of the year. Please contact the school office on 9790 6176 or email the school to let us know as soon as possible.

Teachers consider many factors when grouping children into classes for the next school year and it is never an easy task. Besides the department's guidelines about the number of children in each class at different year levels we also consider:

- academic achievement levels
- special needs and medical issues
- relationships that should be split or continued (teacher/student, student/student)
- behavioural issues or concerns
- the numbers of boys and girls in a class
- teacher allocation

If parents have particular concerns or issues about the placement of their child for next year, now is the time to let the school know so we can consider this information when forming classes. Coming to discuss a child's placement next year once classes have been finalised is too late as we are unable to make changes once classes have started. We always undertake to do the very best we can for every student. Please remember it is not always possible to meet all requests. Specific requests for a particular teacher will not be considered.

Please write to me in a sealed envelope marked confidential by Friday 27th November 2020 with any information that you would like us to consider regarding your child in 2021. All requests are treated confidentially. Please remember that while we will do our best to meet requests, this is not always possible and all decisions made are in the best interests of our students.

As you may have heard in the media there will now be two Staff Development Days in Term 1 2021 instead of the usual two at the end of year in Term 4. This means that students in Year 1 and Year 2 will return to school on <u>Friday 29th January 2021</u>. Wednesday 27th and Thursday 28th will be Staff Development Days. Kindergarten will begin <u>on Monday 1st February 2021</u>. Preschool and Early Intervention will have a staggered start and parents will be informed individually of their start date. Next year we will return into holding classes until numbers are confirmed. Once our numbers are confirmed we will form classes and announce teachers.

Changed Parking Conditions on Stacey St

Thank you to our P&C who have worked tirelessly with us to improve the parking conditions on Stacey Street. We have been working closely with Transport NSW as Stacey St is a state owned road for the past year. While we were unable to secure a kiss and drop zone, 15 minute parking restrictions during school zone hours have been implemented on Stacey St. This will hopefully limit the number of cars that are parking all day in front of the preschool and will hopefully make the pick up and drop off easier for everyone. Please also note that the no stopping zone between the pedestrian crossing and the school driveway has been extended and this whole area is now no stopping. Please do not stop, stand or park in this area in the mornings or afternoons.

The factories and house next door to the preschool have trucks and cars going in and out of their driveways all day. Please ensure that you hold your child's hand and supervise them closely when you walk down Stacey Street, particularly near the driveways. We also have an increasing number of parents turning into the staff driveway to drop off or to turn around. This is extremely dangerous. Please do not use the driveway to drop off students or to make a uturn.

We also have concerns over students using the pedestrian crossing unaccompanied in the morning. We had a very scary near miss last week when a child tried to enter the pedestrian crossing on an angle from the rood, not the footpath and ran straight in front of a truck. We were lucky that our crossing supervisor happened to catch this out of the corner of her eye and stopped the truck. Please do not let children out of the car on the other side of the road to cross by themselves. All students P-2 must be accompanied to the school gate in the morning by an adult and also collected from school grounds in the afternoon by an adult.

I know that the council will be sending rangers to enforce the new 15 minute parking guidelines so please ensure that you are following all the road rules to avoid a fine and to also ensure the safety of our students, staff and community.

<u>Attendance</u>

While we understand that 2020 has had many challenges, particularly with attendance we are hoping for a much smoother 2021. In 2021 we will be returning to our termly attendance party for students with good attendance and will have new, increased measures to work with students who have an attendance rate of less than 90%. Included in this newsletter are the 2021 school dates. Please ensure when booking any holidays that you try your best to book in the school holidays to limit disruption to student learning.



KB have been working hard all year to develop and extend our fundamental skills in English and Mathematics. Here's a snapshot of learning in KB.





School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

<u>Term Bus Pass</u> holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

New Concession Entitlement Cards

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older) \square Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.
