Triple P

During Term 1 Caroline Chisholm School and Bankstown South Infants School collaborated to present the Stepping Stones Triple P Seminar Series via Zoom.

The Triple P – Positive Parenting Program is an internationally-recognised program that gives parents the skills they need to build strong family relationships, manage misbehaviour and prevent problems happening in the first place. Stepping Stones Triple P has been developed for parents of children with a developmental disability.

Parents of preschool to Year 2 children with a disability were invited to attend. The 3 seminars were presented by school counsellor Audrey Hunt, with the support of special education teachers Judy Chan (Bankstown South Infants School) and Peta Fox (Caroline Chisholm School).

Parents from both schools attended and participated in valuable questions and problem solving.
